Brethren,

I want to talk about Light.

Light is the fastest, most pervasive substance in the universe. At a speed of 186,000 miles a second, nothing in the cosmos travels faster.

Last week, I was speaking to a man who was interested in petitioning the Craft. In doing so, I was again provided with an opportunity to reflect on my own view of the Craft and my place in it.

One of the things I said to that man, is that Freemasonry is not passive. Being a Freemason is an action; not a title.

Frankly, I dislike the slogan that so many of us have adopted: "Freemasonry makes good men, better". I believe this statement to be inaccurate; incomplete. The phrase suggests that all one needs to do to become better is simply TO BE a Freemason.

For me, Freemasonry is a *individual* journey <u>and</u> a collective journey. It is about *Light* and reflection. We seek Light and reflect it inwardly and outwardly.

It is easy to forget our teachings and let our day-to-day lives cast a shadow on that Light. We may allow ourselves to become passive, or even completely dormant spiritually or physically. I have been guilty of this more often than I care to admit. Let us all be reminded of what we came here to do!

Freemasonry is a vehicle for this Light, but a vehicle without fuel serves no purpose. Equally, a vehicle with fuel must have a destination or it also serves no function.

As we speed off for another journey around our star, please consider your place as the most important member of our Lodge; a Brother Mason. Think about how you can make our Lodge better and display the tenets of our beautiful Craft.

Let us use this time of renewal to reinvigorate our commitments to the Craft, our Lodge and to each other.
